The YASUKUNI SHRINE was originally established by the first emperor of modern Japan, Emperor Meiji in 1869 in honour of those who fought and died for the country.

MEIJI JINGU is a sacred shrine to Emperor Meiji, modern Japan's first emperor following the fall of the Samurais and his wife, Empress Shoken.



HISTORICAL PLACES!

The horrific events of 1945 inevitably loom large over Hiroshima as a whole with remembrance is at the heart of this, HIROSHIMA PEACE MEMORIAL PARK. Designed by Kenzo Tange, a former practitioner in the Metabolist school mentioned earlier, the park sits on the site cleared by the bombs impact, formally the city's main commercial district. It's purpose is as a memorial to the victims foremost but also aims to act as a center for learning about the use of nuclear weapons.



Designated as Japan's National Treasure, the bronze statue of Amitabha Buddha, which is the principal image of Kotoku-in, is commonly known as the Great BUDDHA OF KAMAKURA (Kamakura Daibutsu in Japanese). The construction of the statue began in 1252 and it was originally enshrined in Daibutsu-den Hall. However, the building was destroyed due to several typhoons and ultimately by a huge tsunami in 1498. Since then, the Buddha has been standing in the open air.



EXPO '70 PARK in Osaka is considered by many to be the last of the great World's Fairs, here events were envisaged as showcases for international advances in technology, architecture and culture, with each nation building its own pavilion.

DAIGO-JI was founded in the early Heian period. In 874, Rigen-daishi (Shōbō) founded the temple. After having fallen ill and abdicated in 930, Emperor Daigo entered Buddhist priesthood at this temple.



One can take a boat ride in Arashiyama, Kyoto surrounded by cherry blossom in Spring.



Higashimokoto Shibazakura Park is home to one of Hokkaido's most famous flower fields. The Shibazakura Festival is timed to coincide with the blossoming of the flowers.

The KOCHI HILL is in n Hitachinaka City at the Hitachi Seaside Park, a vast stretch of rolling hills is jam-packed with the vivid crimson bushes that sway with the breeze, with whimsical Oz-like roads winding throughout.

The KAWACHI FUHI GARDEN are located in Kitakyushu, and features 150 Wisteria plants, along with 20 different species, but the exquisite tunnel is made of cascading flowers.



EXQUISITE PLACES!

The largest of the five fuji lakes, LAKE YAMANAKA, is a haven for swans – both natural and man-made. It is known as “Swan Lake” around the village of Yamanakako, which completely surrounds the lake. It is located in the village of Yamanakako in Yamanashi Prefecture near Mount Fuji, Japan. Lake Yamanaka is the largest of the Fuji Five Lakes in surface area and the highest in elevation.



ISHIGAKI is among the largest islands in the Yaeyama Island archipelago of Japan, with powdery white beaches and undulating mossy hills. Ishigaki serves as a gateway to the Yaeyama Islands. Ishigaki Port is the 5th most popular of Japan's cruise ports as of 2017, and 4th for port calls by non-Japanese ships with a weekly call by Star Cruises from Taiwa. The beach has a relaxing, uncrowded atmosphere with limited amenities.



Arakawa and Gins' Site of Reversible Destiny at YORO PARK , is a created landscape containing a series of pavilions, undulating planes, shifting colors, and disorienting spaces that the artists presented to visitors as a place of purposeful experimentation.

The ICE AQUARIUM is a tourist attraction in Miyagi, Japan, operated by the Okamoto Ice Refrigeration Plant. It features approximately 450 marine creatures that were flash-frozen into blocks of ice after being caught by local fishermen.



FUN IN JAPAN

Mikurajima is one of the Izu Islands located 200 km south of Tokyo. The island is famous for beautiful nature and dolphin swimming. About 150 wild dolphins inhabit around Mikurajima and you can swim with them by snorkeling and free diving.

Pikachu Outbreak is an annual festival held in the Minatomirai neighborhood of Yokohama. Minatomirai is located about 20 miles south of Tokyo. Tokyo DisneySea is a fantasy theme park in Tokyo Disney Resort that is unique to Japan. Inspired by the myths and legends of the sea, Tokyo DisneySea is made.
