HISTORICAL PLACES!



The horrific events of 1945 inevitably loom large over Hiroshima as a whole with remembrance is at the heart of this, HIROSHIMA PEACE MEMORIAL PARK. Designed by Kenzo Tange, a former practitioner in the Metabolist school mentioned earlier, the park sits on the site cleared by the bombs impact, formally the city's main commercialdistrict. It's purpose is as a memorial to the victims foremostbut also aims to act as a center for learning about the use of nuclear weapons.






Designated as Japan's National Treasure, the bronze statue of Amitabha Buddha, which is the principal image of Kotoku-in, is commonly known as the Great BUDDHA OF KAMAKURA (Kamakura Daibutsu in Japanese). The construction of the statue began in 1252 and it was originally enshrined in Daibutsu-den Hall. However, the building was destroyed due to several typhoons and ultimately by a huge tsunami in 1498. Since then, the Buddha has been standing in the open air.



EXPO '70 PARK in Osaka is considered by many to be the last of the great World's Fairs,here events were envisaged as showcases for international advances in technology, architecture and culture, with each nation building its own pavilion. DAIGO-JI was founded in the early Heian period. In 874, Rigen-daishi (Shōbō) founded the temple. After having fallen ill and abdicated in 930, Emperor Daigo entered Buddhist priesthood at this temple.




Arakawa and Gins' Site of Reversible
